NEW BUSINESS:

Referendum Talk

- School Board member Barry Hitchens shared some details and clarifications, as well as here to help offer answers to questions
- The referendum is back on the ballot for April voting, will be asking the same as what was on the ballot Nov
 - Failed 46-54%
 - feedback has been that people who voted against it were not aware in detail of what was at risk if it did not pass
 - o same number 88 cents, generate 20 million in the district if it passes April 14
- School Board meeting last Wednesday discussed what was at risk if it does not pass
 - 5th grade band and orchestra
 - o 6,7, 9 athletics & Schedule B budget reduction
 - Nothing can reduce student safety (ie football pads), but uniforms would have to go longer in between or funding be cut all together
 - Cannot reduce amount that is paid to Schedule B reps as it is contractually bound, but could reduce the number of Schedule B offerings
 - There has already been reduced Schedule B at the elementary level (student council and chess clubs were primarily impacted)
 - No more field trips (education experiences during the day)
 - No more district funded overnight trips (exception is state series qualification events like regionals)
 - Looking at increasing fees (more to come on this, this is restricted on what can and cannot be increased)
 - All of the above are for 2023-2024 school year
 - Future years: all Schedule B activities will be cut
 - If additional revenue is not given, Carlock will be closed (Fox Creek, Parkside Elementary & Prairieland would absorb)
 - Effort is being focused to not impact the 8am 3pm class experience
 - o Board will vote on changes for next year at special meeting next week on Tuesday
 - If revenue is acquired, special meeting will be held shortly after election to modify or reduce these cuts
- Questions/Comments:
 - how do we have non-kid community members get this messaging and understand how these impacts are broader than just the school
 - A healthy school system is a great sign that this is a great community and worth investing in
 - Chatter was "we don't trust they won't still continue to use cash bonds"
 - o 5 candidates are running opposing the referendum, nine total candidates are vying for 4 board seats

- New candidates have to be sworn in on April 26, if challengers do win vacant seats, current board will special vote to implement and reinstate cuts and "lock in" for 2023-2024 school year
- Keep in mind, if this does not pass, cannot go on the ballot again until this time next year, thereby impacting 2 school years
- Dr Weikle has also pitched reducing workforce by 150 (about 15% of 1000 employees)
 - Education fund has \$11 mil deficit (large portion of fund pays teacher salaries)
 - Transportation is \$1.4 mil deficit (partially due to state being behind)
 - O&M still in the black because we continue to make energy efficient changes to help
- How are working cash bonds approved and approved to be used?
 - to issue working cash, the board has to pass an order of the intent, it is made public in the paper, and then vote to issue
 - Typically not opposed, no petitions typically submitted, so can pass without a ballot vote
 - If signatures opposing/petitioning against are received and meet the threshold, board is forced to put issuance of bonds on ballot
